At United Way Fort McMurray and Wood Buffalo, we are dedicated to improving the lives of individuals and families in our community. Waypoints stands at the forefront of the battle against domestic and sexual violence in the Regional Municipality of Wood Buffalo. Their mission is to improve the safety, health, and wellbeing of individuals, families, and communities. Guided by the vision of a society free of domestic and sexual violence, Waypoints offers essential services to those affected by these devastating issues.

Waypoints' Sexual Assault Program is a cornerstone of their work, providing free counseling and support services to individuals who have experienced sexual trauma, such as childhood sexual abuse, sexual assault, or sexual harassment. Recognizing that the ripple effects of sexual violence extend beyond the individual, Waypoints extends their free services to family members, partners, and friends, ensuring a holistic approach to healing.

Their services are not just limited to counseling. Waypoints also engages in client advocacy and community education programs, fostering a community-wide understanding and response to sexual violence. Their collaborative efforts with local authorities, healthcare providers, educational institutions, and various community organizations ensure a comprehensive network of support for survivors.

The statistics are sobering: almost one in every two adult Albertans has experienced some form of sexual abuse in their lifetime. Survivors of childhood sexual abuse are significantly more likely to encounter further abuse as adults. With two out of three Albertans knowing a survivor and one in two having personally supported one, the need for robust support systems is undeniable.

Waypoints addresses this critical need head-on. Their commitment to providing free, accessible counseling and support services is a lifeline for many in our community. By offering these services at no cost, Waypoints ensures that financial barriers do not stand in the way of healing and recovery.

The essential services provided by Waypoints would not be possible without the support of organizations like United Way Fort McMurray and Wood Buffalo. 


SPARKLE IN RED: DANCING WITH THE YMM STARS 2024
